- Create a celebration menu from the kinds of foods you might find on a desert island. Decorate and present it appropriately.
- Make a list of emotions your character might feel when they are first stranded on the Island, at 6 months on the Island and 1 year on the Island.
- Create a mind map of the skills your character might offer to the community on the island and why they are useful.
- **Research and explain the benefits** of a vegan or vegetarian diet for the island inhabitants.
- Perform a speech explaining why 'rites of passage' are important or why they are not important.

Get creative

- Make a mood board for a wedding
- Make a gift for an island baby
- Cook a vegan or vegetarian recipe take photos
- Make a board game about the 'journey of life'
- Make a 3D model of the island
- Make a film about a rite of passage
- Perform a song/rap that could be performed at a ceremony—record it



Numeracy

- Considering scale and using appropriate forms of measurement, create an imaginary map of the layout of our village
- Take a survey of the age, sex and skills (Building/cooking/Healthcare etc) of the people on the island and present your findings in 3 different ways (Pie chart/Histogram/Tally)
- Create an imaginary climate for the island. Work out the average daily rainfall and temperature on our island for each month. Display this in an appropriate graph. Explain how this weather pattern would affect their living conditions and food production.



Literacy

- Read a book about living on an island. Rate it and write a synopsis.
- Write a background story about your character.
- Write a 5-10 question quiz about 'rites of passage'
- Write a newspaper article/blog about the disappearance of the ship
- Create a fact file about a real life island community.
- Research the 'Bermuda Triangle'. Include location, reports of disappearances, criticisms of the idea
- Research the Universal Declaration of Human rights. Choose your top 5 and say why you think they are most important.
- Present a role play of one of the rites of passage you have studied and record it.
- Keep a weekly diary of how your character is dealing with life on the island.
